



It's a pleasure to be able to greet you again through this *Tidings* article. Believe it or not, six months—half a year—has passed since I've last communicated with you in this way. In this space I can only **outline some of Old Trinity's most significant comings and goings** in a brief and breezy way:

Several seasons of the Church year have come and gone: Old Trinity said goodbye to the long season of ordinary time at the end of October, and we celebrated or observed All Saints, Reformation Sunday, the Women's Thank Offering Sunday, Christ the King, Advent, Christmas, the Feast of the Name of Jesus (January 1), Epiphany. On Ash Wednesday, February 26, we've entered the holy season of Lent.

Old Trinity experienced pastoral comings and goings. On August 1 I left for a three-month long sabbatical. I spent almost the entire twelve weeks at Sabah Theological Seminary (STS) in Kota Kinabalu, Sahab, Malaysia. STS is an institution (in some ways the central institution) of the Basel Christian Church in Malaysia (BCCM). While at STS I taught a course in Christian ethics and learned far more about the work of Christ through the BCCM, and of the resilience of the Church of Christ generally.

As I was going away, **Pastor Libby Buuch** came in as Trinity's sabbatical interim pastor. I am grateful for the faithful, creative, warm, and competent ministry Pastor Libby shared during what turned out to be a tumultuous time for the congregation. As is good, right, and usually recommended, when I came back from sabbatical Pastor Libby stepped away from the community, at least for a time, so Old Trinity could re-establish its relationship with its called pastor.

There have been staff departures and arrivals during these months. During the sabbatical, our beloved Minister of Music, **Dr. Tom Wells**, suffered a stroke and had to step away from his position. We pray for his quick and complete recovery and expect to see him back in some way on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. Just as the sabbatical was ending **Mary Reed-Farris**, our Administrative Assistant of almost 10 years, left. We wish her well and thank her for her ministry to the Lord at Old Trinity. Dealing with these departures has been a major challenge since my time back.

Thanks be to God, we found **Dr. Tom Kolar**, our Interim Minister of Music and Organist, or maybe he found Old Trinity, just in time to prepare our choirs for a beautiful Christmas celebration. What a fantastical Christmas gift he has been! And just a few weeks ago Old Trinity was delighted to welcome **Wes Anderson** as the congregation's new Administrative Assistant. Credit Wes with re-booting, preparing and mailing out this issue of the Tidings! And be sure to stop in to welcome Wes, just about any weekday morning.

Old Trinity has mourned to see members go, and we are excited to prepare for new members to come. Just after Christmas, on December 18, our sister Peg Beeson died, and Irene Thurston died just a few weeks ago, on February 10. It was a joy to commend them into the loving arms of Jesus in the sure and certain hope of the resurrection at their funerals at old Trinity. Also quite sad, but not unusual during a time of transition for a congregation, a few of our most beloved members discerned that my return to was the right time for them to leave Old Trinity. Of course we hope none of them will be long gone from us, we wish them well, and we are grateful for their ministry among us!

Old Trinity is preparing to receive new members at Eatser time. All of these siblings in Christ--Herb and Jeneane Hufford, Sarah Leake, Robbie Little, and Elizabeth Lockhart have been worshipping with us for some time, but we rejoice that they have decided to formalize their membership by affirming their baptism here. Please keep all of these folks in your prayers as they prepare to do so.

Finally, we have outgoing and incoming members of our church council. At our annual meeting we expressed our sincere gratitude for our outgoing councilpersons: Larry Faelchle as president, Steve Mayer as Treasurer, Community Ministry Chair Mayda Vazquez, Worship Chair Donna Bowman, Property Chair David Huskey. We are thankful for our incoming council members: Gretchen Brandt as President, Jessie Holtz as Treasurer, Shiela Hively with Community Ministry, Ken Fultz with the Worship Team, Sarah Leake with Communications and Evangelism, and Larry Faelchle on Property. They will be joining our returning members: Vice President Neal Coryell, Secretary Bob Nida, Nichole Botkin with Spiritual Formation, and Amy Hehr with Congregational Life.

The Lord has kept and blessed Old Trinity through all of these coming and goings. May the promise that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus keep us now and forever. Amen!

# **Weekend Worship Services in March**

Saturdays at 5:00 p.m., Sundays at 10:30 a.m.

March 1<sup>st</sup> The First Sunday of Lent We follow Jesus into the desert to be tempted. The Son shows us that God calls all God's children to use our gifts, talents, and abilities to serve the Lord in the world, just as Jesus serves us his very Body and Blood, week by week. On Sundays, we feast, even in Lent.

March 8<sup>th</sup> The Second Sunday of Lent Jesus shows Nicodemus that we must be born of water and Spirit. That as God made a covenant with Abraham, in baptism God promises to raise us up with Christ to new life. From worship we are sent forth to proclaim God's love for all the world.

March 15<sup>th</sup> The Third Sunday of Lent As we continue to prepare for baptism at Easter, we are reminded of the continuing grace of God. He gives water to the Israelites in the desert, promises grace to even utterly helpless sinners, and shares living water in his son, calling all people to faith.

March 22<sup>th</sup> The Fourth Sunday of Lent Our faith is renewed and we rejoice in our baptism and the miracles of faith. As David was anointed with oil. despite being seen as unworthy, and as a blind man was made to see by Jesus' love, we are called to witness the light of salvation in our daily lives.

The Fifth Sunday of Lent God promises resurrection. In baptism we die with Christ that we may be raised with him to new life. Jesus reveals this power in giving new life to Lazarus, and we are reminded that Jesus too would rise again.



This year our noon and evening Lenten gatherings will be quite distinct from one another! The mid-day devotions will be brief organ recitals built around simple prayer and Lenten themes.
