Children's / Youth Christian Education:

Prior to April Council meeting, presented a motion to approve a job description for a Children's Minister position. All positive feedback from Council members. We will formalize the vote during the April 10th Council meeting.

ROLE UPDATE:

After having talked with a few candidates, we believe that we can get a little more Christian Education with the role, for a little more time from the person and with a little more involvement from Pastor and Spiritual Formation. Accordingly, we've enhanced the role from a Nursery Attendant. We're still going for a role like that which Brea Porter served, but with some light children's Christ Ed duties as well. The latest title we've come up with is: Children's Minister.

RECRUITING INTENTIONS:

Jane Nida has said that she is not interested in the full-time role, but will cover for us until we fill the role. As we recruit for the role, we will be satisfied if we find a good candidate like Brea. If we find someone who would like to do more with the role, the job description allows for those possibilities. 2018 BUDGET IMPACT:

Since we only need to cover 9 months in 2018 and we have ~\$1350 remaining in the budget for this position. We will try to manage to the \$1500 2018 budget, by going light on lessons in the Summer and should be able to cover the expanded role for the year. If there is some small

overage (< \$300 worst case), we can fund that by trading off somewhere else in the Spiritual Formation budget.

SUPERVISION:

In day-to-day activities, the Children's Minister will report to Amy Hehr, who will take on the supervisory function and will handle communications with all parties. Any Christ Ed teaching will be done under supervision of Pastor and Spiritual Formation.

Youth & Family Ministry:

The Intergenerational 4th Saturday event on March 24th, was a good time and was centered around the Property clean up day. Thanks to David Huskey for partnering with us on the event and for the tour of Old Trinity's coolest spaces. Next 4th Saturday events will be:

Position: Children's Minister

Vision:

The Children's Minister ensures the nursery is a secure, nurturing environment where each child will see, hear and feel the love of Jesus Christ and parents can feel confident their child will receive the highest quality of care and ministry. The Children's Minister contributes to our church's mission to "Share the Word of God through worship and teaching, love and service, in our congregation in our community" by building an ongoing, weekly relationship with our children during Sunday morning worship.

Job Summary:

The Children's Minister is responsible for the care of toddlers and early-elementary-aged children during Sunday morning worship. In addition, he or she may prepare and present lessons or activities for children in the nursery, under the direction of the Spiritual Formation Team and Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church

Time Commitment:

- Approx 2 hours every Sunday: 10:15 a.m.- 12:15 p.m. currently and some special events
- Additional time required to prepare lessons or activities for the children
- May distribute take home Christian Education lessons, teachings, and materials to parents and families regardless of their attendance, to extend Spiritual Formation into families' homes
- Total Monthly hours = 7-15 hours

Compensation:

- \$12-\$20/hour based on experience and qualifications
- Time paid for lesson preparation
- Possibility for special event pay on an as-needed basis

Qualifications:

- 1. Seeking a nurturing, caring, patient caregiver who enjoys working with young children. Experience in early childhood development or youth and family ministry a plus.
- 2. Ability to communicate effectively with parents.
- 3. Dependability.

- 4. Reliable transportation.
- 5. CPR and First Aid certified or willingness to become certified.
 6. Satisfactory completion of background check.
- 7. Must be 16 years of age or older.
- 8. Provide three references: one personal, two professional9. Ability and eagerness to share and teach Christian faith in accordance with the Lutheran tradition
